It gives me great pleasure to welcome you all to Celtic Media Festival 2024 in Cardiff. We are deeply grateful to Cymru Greadigol/ Creative Wales, S4C and BBC Cymru/ Wales and to all the individuals who have worked to bring our festival back to the capital of Wales, one of the major centres of media production and innovation in Europe.

It has been my great privilege for many years now to witness the work of the driving forces of the Celtic Media Festival, Catriona Logan, Festival Director, and Naomi Henry-Wright, Festival Manager. My admiration for the two of them never ceases as they reinvent and revitalise our Festival annually, and always in a different place. I remember very clearly our first 'recce' trip to Brittany in January 2019, hoping to bring the Festival back to the European mainland for the first time in almost two decades. Two years of Covid put that dream on hold but the pandemic brought out the remarkable resilience and innovation of the Festival's Executive and Board as we successfully steered through one of the most challenging periods our Festival has ever faced and produced the first 'virtual' festivals in our history. And what a joy in 2022 to eventually take CMF to the energetic, vibrant Breton city of Quimper which provided the perfect location for the renewal of our Festival. In 2023 we decided to take on the major logistical challenge of trying to return the Festival to the rural community roots of its first edition in Benbecula in 1980.

Bringing such a large contingent of festival attendees to the village of Dungloe/ An Clochán Liath and the surrounding Gaeltacht area was undoubtedly a risk, but the reward was a festival which no-one who attended will ever forget, for the quality of the conference programme, the excellence of the social events and the full week of wonderful Donegal sunshine!

As someone who has spent over thirty-five years involved in Celtic language broadcasting in Ireland and Scotland, it is a great personal pleasure for me to see our Festival return to Wales, the Celtic country which views its own minority language as a priority for investment and which pioneered and continues to lead in the area of Celtic language broadcasting. And it is directly from the quality of its professionals and from those skills honed through Welsh broadcasting that Wales has attracted screen producers from all over the globe and created some of the world's biggest audience brands.

This festival continues to diversify and to internationalise and I would especially this year like to welcome our colleagues from Whakaata Māori in Aotearoa/ New Zealand, from APTN in Canada and from Hakka TV in Taiwan. Their presence, and the presence of all our attendees, underlines that the Celtic Media Festival remains a place where the local inspiration and the universal vision collide, are celebrated and, through alliances and partnership, grow.

Nid yw fy edmygedd o'r ddwy byth yn pallu wrth weld y ffordd maent yn mynd ati i ail ddyfeisio ac adfywi'r Wŷl bob blwyddyn, a bob tro mewn lleoliad gwahanol. Rwy'n cofio'n iawn ein taith gyntaf i Lydaw yn 2019 gan obeithio dod â'r Wŷl yn ôl i dir mawr Ewrop am y tro cyntaf mewn ugain mlynedd. Bu i ddwy flynedd o Covid atal y freuddwyd dros dro ond fe welsom, yn ystod y pandemig, gydweithio ac arloesedd anhygoel y Bwrdd a thîm rheoli'r Wŷl wrth i ni lywio'n ffordd drwy un o'r adegau mwyaf heriol yn ein hanes gan gynhyrchu'r Wŷl rithiol cyntaf yn ein hanes. Mor felys oedd hi felly i fynd â'r Wŷl i Quimper yn Llydaw gan gychwyn unwaith eto o'r newydd. Yn 2023 aethom ati i ymrafael â'r her o fynd â'r Wŷl nôl i'w gwreiddiau cymunedol fel a gafwyd yn yr Wŷl gyntaf un yn Benbecula ym 1980.

Born in the US of Galician and Ukrainian parents, Wolodymyr "Vlad" Smishkewych has enjoyed a 25-year career as a singer specializing in early and contemporary music, sharing the stage with some of the main names in early music and folk, including Carlos Nuñez, Jordi Savall and Hesperion XXI, Sequentia, Theatre of Voices, and The Harp Consort. He has recorded for Sony/BMG, Harmonia Mundi, and Naxos Records. No stranger to the academic realm, he holds a doctorate from Indiana University, and is the former director of the MA programme in Chant at the University of Limerick, Ireland, where he taught until 2014.

However, his passion for writing and creating media about music and culture goes back to 2006, when he was a Fulbright Fellow to Spain, after which he began writing programmes for National Public Radio (USA). After his time in academia, Vlad returned to performing and the world of broadcasting, joining Ireland's RTÉ lyric fm as well as the European Early Music Network, as radio announcer and producer. He is best known to Irish radio listeners as the host and researcher of Vox Nostra, lyric fm's Sunday morning Early Music show.

Based in the Mid-West of Ireland, Vlad is co-director of the Limerick Early Music Festival and of H.I.P.S.T.E.R. Ireland (Historically Informed Performance Series, Teaching, Education, and Research), as well as Now and Then Media, a production company dedicated to live and recorded music events and documentaries about music and culture.
